Position Summary: Join an AmeriCorps crew working on conservation projects throughout New Mexico. Applicants must be available for day work in the Albuquerque area and multi-day overnight trips up to 8 days. Both day work and backcountry camping is required.

Position Purpose: Crews will complete projects such as trail construction and maintenance, habitat restoration, historic preservation, watershed restoration, disaster relief and other conservation projects. Crews will collaborate with local and national agencies including the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Forest Service, the National Park Service, Bureau of Indian Affairs, and local tribal agencies. All Corpsmembers will receive personal and professional development trainings such as CPR/First Aid, financial management, and public speaking skills.



Location: This position is based in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Our office is located at Valle de Oro National Wildlife Refuge, at 7851 2nd Street SW. **Participants must have reliable transportation** to and from this location, according to their work schedule.

Combination of "Spike" and "Day Crew" Schedule	April 9 – August 3, 2018	 <u>Spike Schedule:</u> 8 days on, 6 days off: Tuesday-Tuesday, with additional hours or modified schedule possible. Schedules may vary based on project location and crew. Be available for possible 30-day disaster deployment. <u>Day Crew Schedule:</u> Be available for urban project work on a day-to-day schedule. This includes in-town, non-overnight project work with a more traditional Monday-Friday daily schedule, without camping availability.

Participants will attend occasional service/training days outside of this schedule, including weekends.


Living Stipend	AmeriCorps Term	Segal Education Award

This is an AmeriCorps position and corpsmembers will receive a **living stipend** throughout the season, as well as a **Segal Education Award** upon successful completion of the term of service. This award can be used to pay tuition at most colleges, universities, and trade schools, or to pay off student loans already incurred.

Corpsmembers are eligible for health insurance during their term of service. **Crew transportation is provided** from RMYC headquarters to project sites. For camping crews, **food for crew meals is provided** while on Spike and some personal **camping gear is available to borrow/rent** during the season.

Essential Functions:

- Regularly hike on uneven terrain while carrying tools, gear, or other equipment
- Frequently required to walk, sit, talk, listen
- Reach with hands and arms and lift or move up to 50 pounds
- Perform twisting and swinging motions
